

About The Workshop

IACUC-Advanced was developed by the Scientists Center for Animal Welfare to train individuals concerned with science and appropriate animal welfare. They may include experienced IACUC members and administrators, principal investigators, attending veterinarians, regulatory personnel and laboratory animal care staff. The regional workshop format lets small groups discuss specific, advanced topics that are relevant to IACUC functions. Each workshop is structured in similar, design, with slight changes made to meet local needs.

It is expected that this course will be approved for hours of continuing education credit in jurisdictions which recognize **AAVSB RACE** approval; however participants should be aware that some boards have limitations on the number of hours accepted in certain categories and/or restrictions on certain methods of delivery of continued education. 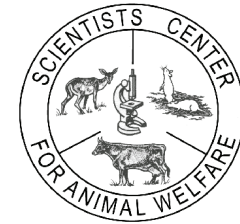
